# What is SPS (Special Needs Support)

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Support for students with a mental or neurological diagnosis, a physical disability, or students with dyslexia or dyscalculia

Students must document their condition to receive SPS support.

Students are supported by a counselor, a mentor, or by an aid (could e.g., be computer programs).

# How does SPS help?

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Students with a mental or neurological diagnosis is supported by a counselor (and sometimes a mentor).

Focus on the individuals' problems and strengths –  
Sometimes caused by their condition.

# How does SPS help?

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Issues:

Structure/planning, Coping with study and life, Being in the situation, Fear of performing, What comes after a Master's thesis, etc.

We do not discuss:

The academic approach and substance, actual content of a thesis, etc.

# How to use SPS

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Students with a mental or neurological diagnosis, a physical disability or dyslexia/dyscalculia can contact the [SPS administration at SDU](#).

SPS also offers test on dyslexia/dyscalculia.
