Subject 1: Visit from the Dean	Explanation The Dean will visit the BioMS section prior to the MG meeting (13-14). The Dean will stay for the first 30 minuts of the MG meeting.	Reflections on the Dean's visit to the BioMS section: The Dean met with JMJ and the Principal Investigators of the BioMS section. The section-specific visits, which replace the previous "Dean's corner" format, provides the Dean with a closer view/details on the individual sections and their strategies. The meeting format works well – but a little more emphasis on future plans would be ideal for future section visits. When asked if the Dean would have liked background material prior to the meeting, she highlighted that the BMB webpages (incl. section webpages) were very nice and informative. She read them prior to the meeting and it contained all relevant information. If a section strategi is available, it can be sent to the Dean prior to the visit. Discussion with the Dean: The possibilities for increasing external funding and growth was discussed. 		As the student uptake is expected to drop in the coming years the need to reduce student dropout rate was also discussed. 2:	Meeting frequencies and participation at BMB. - The number of participants at the Department Forum was very low. What could be the reason?	The frequency of the Department Forum has been low for the past couple of years – due to Corona, but also as a cause of a general plan to reduce the number of meetings to lower the workload at the individual employees.
