	Agenda:	Action:
1.	Welcome	We decided on our previous meeting that minutes are approved in writing shortly after the meeting.
2.	Qualification guidelines – Richard Mee	On basis of REEAD (Research, Education, External funding, Academic, Dissemination) each department has been asked by the dean to revise the qualification guidelines. The purpose is to illustrate what is expected of academic staff at appointment and illustrate the conditions for promotion (the promotion scheme for Associate Professors, replacing the Professor WSR, is also currently under discussion). It is expected that the new guidelines will be effective from January 2023, following an ongoing process of consultation and iteration. Questions were raised as to the weighting of the criteria: Research and Education are the primary factors, with the others as secondary. The recognition of outreach and dissemination was welcomed. Dannie mentioned that Assistant Professors in the Department are appointed for four years rather than three, to give them a realistic opportunity for development.

		It was stressed that the document presents a set of guidelines rather than a checklist. The aim of the guidelines is to clearly indicate the expectations for each staff category with certain degrees of flexibility. There was some discussion of the Research Groups' Target Journals list and how interpretation differed from Group to Group. There was agreement that if it was to be useful, the list of journals should be both aspirational and indicate the Groups' current research focus. The purpose of the list has to be very clear if it shall be there at all. The guidelines serve a good purpose to help people with directions and aiming, but it must be framed carefully, because they are also ambitious which can stress people.
3.	DBM & SDU BS news	HA Elite As informed on the department meeting last week, we would like to establish a HA Elite or Talent Track and the dean is supporting this. We expect small intakes of students in future, and we want those we get to stay and not drop out. One vision is to have only one HA in Odense and maybe different ones on other campuses. We could also have two HAs whereas one is elite stimulating the other students to do better. We aspire for engaged students.
		Funding The Prime Minister announced the other day that they are looking at reducing the length of master programmes. If this will be the case, we will have less STÅ income, which is another reason why funding is necessary. Dannie is very satisfied with the number of applications this time and his expression is that people are serious and motivated. The expression from the council is the same.

		How can we optimize the percentage of getting funding? We can try to optimize our quality of applications and there must be an element of persistence too. Reality shows that it takes several applications before you get the approval. But we also somehow should try to change the politics around these funding bodies, who are members and who are not. Furthermore, the department council thinks we could be better at using each other internally and use our network when writing / sending in applications. Dannie is supportive of people taking a week somewhere to focus on grant applications.
		The idea of having a department seminar / workshop for junior researchers on grant development was well received. We expect there will be a pop-up meeting this fall followed by various activities in the spring.
		Some groups already give each other feedback on applications. But in a wider group it can be sensitive to share one's ideas because it is your future work you discuss, and you cannot make claim afterwards on any shared ideas.
		Christian Møller Dahl is a former member of DFF who we should invite to a meeting.
