1. News from IST

Taken by:

<u>Finances:</u> JBN is looking at the 2019 budget presently. Annual grant in 2019 is DKK 20,000 per full time academic employee (VIP). Some units have DVIP-budgets, the heads of research from these units will make agreements for the 2019-budgets at the future Performance and Development Review (PDR) with JBN.

New positions: The budget for the coming years makes it possible to employ a small number of time-limited academic employees, around 2 full-time equivalents. The heads of research are asked to bring their wishes along to their PDR. The IST secretariat is planning a future structure like the other departments at SDU – namely a centralized secretariat. IST has postponed this process because of geographical issues but increasing demands for qualifications make it essential at the latest when the department moves to NytSUND. In Esbjerg the secretariat will be centralized in 2020, when they move to new premises.

Concerning employment and renewals: These requests arrive often far too late at the IST-secretariat and thus also far too late at the Human Resource Services. It is very inconvenient for everybody involved.

IST - Research Regulations "Forskningsinstruks" IST's research regulations were presented by local DPO Marie Kruse and Lars Hvidberg.

The data security legislation has not changed considerably, but the consequences of not abiding by the rules have increased markedly.

Almost all data at IST is health information and therefore sensitive information.

Implementation of the research regulations is work in progress and it is scheduled for February 2019.

As a rule, project documentation must be placed securely, but with access for at least one other employee.

Please send amendments to Marie Kruse or Line Ulstrup. Initially, the regulations will be in Danish only, but the final version will be translated into English.

5. Bordet rundt

<u>PTA:</u> She has participated in the conference "The University of the Future" at SDU/Esbjerg with focus on: Where are the universities heading? Regional campuses in the future, how? 145 participants: SDU employees and directors as well as regional and national politicians.

Health Promotion has organized a strategic seminar on February 5-6, 2019 to discuss focus and research for the coming 3-5 years.

<u>PG:</u> Teaching on Prevention and Global Health starts this spring.

<u>DGH:</u> DaCHE employees presently participate in many conferences and workshops abroad and DaCHE has several visitors from Denmark and abroad.

<u>BN:</u> User Perspectives hosted the conference "User involvement 2.0" January 28, 2019 with approx. 120 participants. Subjects discussed were e.g. quantum physics, user involvement in computer programming, and village development.

<u>KC:</u> Several employments at EBB at the moment: 3 DARC postdocs (1 at EBB, 1 at General Practice and 1 at Dept. for the Study of Culture). Marianne Nygaard has been employed as associate professor, and another associate professor is expected to be employed at Biostatistics.

CPOP is functioning well as an autonomous section and continues to have a good research collaboration with EBB.



<u>KB:</u> There is an issue about GDPR in the clinics; who can see the patient records, if you are not part of the treatment team? It may have practical consequences for research. In January 2019 three associate professors were employed, and a professorship is expected.
