Appendix 1

ECTS-based norm catalogue

Which activities are to be covered by the norm pool for teaching and administration of exams?

The following activities are included in and must be covered by the norm pool:

- teaching hours
- preparation of teaching hours
- conducting the exam (ordinary and re-exam)
- teaching evaluation
- feedback for students
- overall interaction with students
- handling exam appeals

The following activities are excluded from the norm pool and are set aside separately:

- course responsibility tasks, including management of student teachers and coordination
- preparation of exam papers/preparation of exams

Distribution of the norm pool

For each course, the norm pool is divided into two types of main activities, which are reflected in the two categories:

- 1. ECTS rate: *teaching* incl. teaching preparation, teaching evaluation, possible feedback on voluntary practical assignments, overall interaction with students (academic questions)
- 2. Class size rate: exam administration, incl. feedback on exam papers, handling of exam appeals

For each of the two main activities, a *percentage distribution* is made among the teachers/examiners involved.

Information for external lecturers and PhD students

External lecturers and PhD students draw from the norm pool in the same way as other lecturers, but are paid individually on the basis of activities.

Time of distribution of the norm pool

A course is planned (and the norm pool distributed) at the beginning of the semester preceding the semester in which the course is to be offered. Here, both teaching and exam assignments are to be agreed. This allows the individual employee to plan their own work commitments.⁹

Development hours

Separate norm hours are allocated for major developments/restructuring of courses. These are agreed with the VILU and registered in the norm pool 'Teaching and education-related tasks (UU)'.

Which activities are covered by the norm pool for supervision?

The following activities are included in and must be covered by the norm pool:

- booking appointments with a student
- supervision
- preparation of supervision
- preparation of oral defence
- conducting an oral defence

The length of bachelor projects and master's theses (BA Jura, HA (law), cand.jur., cand.merc.jur.)

The students' bachelor projects must not exceed the following number of characters:

- 1 student: 60,000 characters (approx. 20–25 pages)
- 2 students: 84,000 characters (approx. 30–35 pages)
- 3 students: 108,000 characters (approx. 40–45 pages)

The students' master's theses must not exceed the following number of characters:

- 1 student: 140,000 characters (approx. 60 pages)
- 2 students: 200,000 characters (approx. 80 pages)
- 3 students: 250,000 characters (approx. 95 pages)

Appendix 2
