

Guidelines for the use of plagiarism reports in StrikePlagiarism

When using StrikePlagiarism, it is important to comply with the following guidelines.

1. General information about data from StrikePlagiarism

It is fundamentally important to remember that data from StrikePlagiarism must be treated confidentially.

This means, among other things, that you must not discuss data in places where unauthorized persons can learn about the data you process.

Especially about plagiarism reports

It is particularly important that you are aware that the plagiarism reports do not only contain data regarding the assignment being analyzed, but also contains information about previous assignments that is used as a basis for assessing whether plagiarism has occurred.

These reports must therefore be treated with particular care, and may not be shared outside StrikePlagiarism.

2. Use of IT equipment for working with data

It is recommended to only work with the plagiarism report from StrikePlagiarism online.

If you use private IT equipment to work with data from the program, it is important that you ensure that unauthorized persons cannot access the data. This can be done, for example, by using password-protected folders.

You must always remember to delete data from the computer when you have finished working.

3. Sharing of Information from StrikePlagiarism

When you work with data from StrikePlagiarism, it may sometimes be necessary to share information with others.

If you need to share information with others, SDU recommends that you use the sharing feature available in StrikePlagiarism.

If you are required to send data, comments or the like to other people in connection with work on a plagiarism case, it is important that you use a secure email or a secure file sharing service to share the information.

4. Using USB sticks or other portable medias for sharing information

It is not permitted to use USB-Sticks or similar portable storage media to move or store data from StrikePlagiarism.

The sharing of information must preferably be done through the sharing function in StrikePlagiarism.
